Course Description:

This course emphasizes singing and performing techniques, beginning theory, analysis of music and the development of basic vocal technique. A general overview of music development through history and careers in music will also be studied. Participation in a concert performance is a requirement for the class grade. Students will learn proper breath support, good posture and diction. A variety of choral literature and songs in foreign languages will be studied.

Course Objectives: The student will...

- 1. demonstrate proper posture and breathing techniques to support vocal production.
- 2. sing with a free and clear tone, using accurate intonation.
- 3. sing with purity of vowels and clarity of consonants.
- 4. perform dynamics and tempos as indicated by markings in the score in both solo and ensemble singing.
- 5. perform an assigned vocal part in unison and in simple harmony.
- 6. respond to basic conducting gestures.
- 7. respond to music through movement.
- 8. read and write basic music notation.
- 9. study selections that represent various historical, stylistic, and cultural contexts of choral music.

Classroom Expectations:

- 1. Be on time. (I am counting tardies.)
- 2. Be prepared. (Have your music and pencil ready.)
- 3. Be respectful. (Treat others the way you want to be treated.)
- 4. Do your best! (That's all I ask of you.)

Consequences for behavior:
